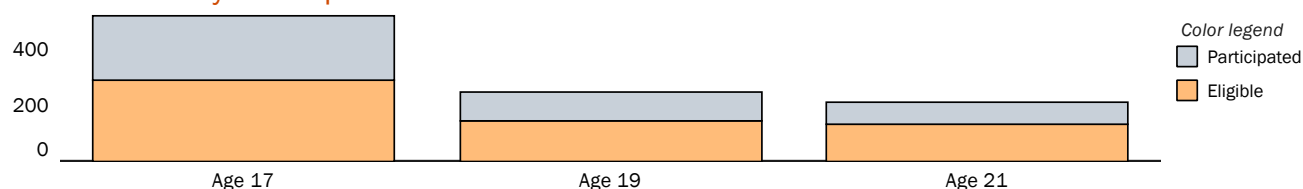

Youth Outcomes at Baseline & Follow up

Cohort 3 Survey Participation²



This graph displays the number of youth who were eligible to take the survey and the number who participated. Survey data are displayed for age 17, 19, and 21.

Age 17: eligible 290 and participated 229, resulting in a participation percentage of 79%.

Age 19: eligible 145 and participated 102, resulting in a participation percentage of 70%.

Age 21: eligible 132 and participated 77, resulting in a participation percentage of 58%.

² 'Eligible' participants include all youth reported by the state as in foster care at age 17 at baseline and all youth in the follow-up population at ages 19 and 21 not reported as incarcerated, incapacitated or deceased. 'Participated' includes youth who were reported to have provided at least one valid response to a survey question.

³ 'Other' may include late surveys, Outcome Reporting Status of "participated" but no valid survey responses, or Outcomes Reporting Status had a value of blank or out-of-range.

⁴ Please note that all races are mutually exclusive and exclude children of Hispanic origin. Children of Hispanic ethnicity may be any race.

⁵ For these outcomes, the baseline cohort is surveyed on their occurrence during their lifetime. At follow up, the cohort is surveyed on the occurrence of these outcomes in the past 2 years.

⁶ The marriage at child's birth percentage is based on the percentage of those who had children. Similarly, the medical percentage is based on the percentage of those who had other health insurance coverage.

⁷ The mental health and prescription drugs percentages are based on the medical percentage.

—NA indicates not applicable; only youth who have been discharged from foster care are asked about receiving public assistance on the NYTD survey.
