\* North Carolina was missing SNAP data for August and September 2019 due to system reporting issues, which affected the calculation of the most recent 3-month average SNAP caseload for October 2019. Unemployment data for Puerto Rico was not available for March or April 2020. Note: A state is eligible to access the TANF Contingency Fund if they meet requirement B or C. Only the 50 states and Washington DC are eligible for TANF Contingency Funds.
